Montreal is Canada's second largest city and the largest in Quebec. Located on the banks of the historic St. Lawrence River, the city boasts a vibrant blend of history and modernity. With a greater proportion of functionally bilingual residents than any other city in the country, Montreal exemplifies the balance between French and English (and a few dozen other languages besides!)

### **GETTING AROUND MONTREAL**

Montreal is served by the Pierre-Eliot-Trudeau International Airport, with flights arriving daily from all over the country. An express bus is available from the airport which will drop you off right in front of the Queen Elizabeth Hotel and Conference Centre. Also handy to the hotel is Central Station for travellers arriving by Via Rail. Montreal's public transit network includes regular bus and metro service to all key locations within the city. Taxi service is readily available.



### **SHOPPING**

Montreal is a virtual paradise for shoppers of all stripes, boasting a number of exciting shopping districts. From a network of shopping malls connected by an underground city, to upscale downtown department stores, to funky independent boutiques, to year-round public markets, there is something for everyone. Be sure to save some room in your suitcase!



## **DINING**

Whatever your taste, you will find something to love in Montreal's renowned restaurant scene! Whether your tastes run to fine French cuisine, exotic African and Asian dishes, or cozy delicatessens, you're sure to enjoy a memorable dining experience. Be sure not to miss the local favourites, smoked meat sandwiches (enjoy one with a black cherry soda!) and our beloved hand-rolled, wood-fired Montreal bagels.

## **EXPLORE MONTREAL ATTRACTIONS**

Montreal has many fascinating museums to explore. For history buffs, there is the McCord Museum of Canadian History, the Montreal History Centre and the Pointe-à-Callière Museum of Archaeology and History. Like science? Be sure to check out the Montreal Science Centre, Biodome, Planetarium, Insectarium and Botanical Garden. Also worth visiting are the Olympic Park, the Canadian Centre for Architecture, the Montreal Canadiens Hall of Fame, and the city's many art galleries.



Atop Mount Royal you will find Mount Royal Park, a 200 hectare green space in the heart of the city. The park, inaugurated in 1876, is home to lookouts, historic monuments, picnic areas, outdoor sculptures, and a network of paths for biking and hiking in the summer, cross-country skiing and snowshoeing in the winter. Several other beautiful parks are located around the city, including Lafontaine Park in the Plateau district, and Jean-Drapeau Park on Île Notre-Dame, both of which are accessible by metro.

## **EXPLORE THE REGION**

Take some time to visit the regions around Montreal. Discover spacious parks and golf courses, spas and resorts, local artisans and antique shops, and an abundance of delicious local foods, from Quebec's famous maple syrup to our wide assortment of gourmet cheeses.

## **ARTS AND ENTERTAINMENT**

Montreal is famous for its vibrant, diverse arts scene. Live music can be heard every night around the city, from the jazz clubs to the indie music scene to the world-renowned Montreal Symphony Orchestra. Theatre enthusiasts will find plenty to love, with a long list of theatre companies performing around the city in a variety of styles in both English and French. Visitors can catch a comedy show at the Just for Laughs theatre, or spend a night out at the Opéra de Montréal. Montreal is also home to a number of art galleries, including the Museum of Fine Arts and the Museum of Contemporary Arts.

## **SPORTS AND LEISURE ACTIVITIES**

Take a walk or a bike ride along the paths of Mount Royal Park, or the historic Lachine Canal. No room to pack your bike? Not to worry! Just check out a bike from Montreal's wildly successful Bixi rental bike network (see [www.bixi.com](http://www.bixi.com) for more information).

Interested in watching some sports while you're here? Montreal is home to a number of professional sports teams, including the storied Canadiens hockey club, the Alouettes of the Canadian Football League and the Impact of the United Soccer League. With six universities in and around the city, Montreal can also boast top-notch university sporting events!
